As caretakers of the health of Seattle's waters, Seattle Public Utilities is working on long-term planning to understand issues in our sewer and drainage systems and is working with community to plan those investments. These improvements protect the health of the public and Longfellow Creek. Repairing our pipes and building green solutions allows SPU to clean and slow water before it gets to Longfellow Creek.

Join the Innovation Team


