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Hazardous Materials Inventory Statements – For New Permits for Medical Gas, Labs, Spray Finishing, Hazardous Materials Use/Storage

Hazardous Materials Inventory Statements (HMISs) are an essential part of the permit review process for several types of permits, including medical gas, laboratories, spray finishing and hazardous materials.

Effective June 1, 2016, these documents will be required to be submitted at the same time the application for a new permit is submitted rather than after the application has already been submitted.

Why Make the Change? The permitting process will be more efficient for our customers and our team when hazardous materials inventory information is available at the time of permit application.

Which Permits Require an HMIS? New permits with the following permit codes will require an HMIS to be submitted at the time the permit is applied for:

4501	Limited Spray Finishing
4502	Spray Finishing Process/Non-Marine
4503	Spray Finishing Process/Non-Marine/Above Permit Quantities
4504	Marine Spray Finishing Process/Below Permit Quantities
4505	Marine Spray Finishing Process/Above Permit Quantities
7904	Bulk Plant or Terminal
801 Series	Variety of Hazardous Gases/Liquids/Solids
8002	Laboratories
