

## Second Avenue Protected Bike Lane Installation Nighttime work September 5 - 8

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will be finalizing installation of the Second Avenue Protected Bike Lane Demonstration Project September 5-8. **Work will occur between 7:30 PM and 7:30 AM Friday, Saturday, and Sunday night beginning on the north side of Pike Street at First Avenue, proceeding along the east side of Second Avenue, and finishing on Yesler Way at Occidental Avenue.** During this time crews will install pavement markings, plastic posts, signage, and other project features.

This work is weather dependent and may be rescheduled to a later date.

### Driveway Access

Areas where the bike lane intersects with driveways will be identified with green material. Crews will install the green material one half of the driveway at a time to maintain access.


### Project Information

The Second Avenue Protected Bike Lane Demonstration Project will physically separate people riding bikes from people driving. This project will help Seattle better understand how to build and operate great protected bike lanes. Pronto! Cycle Share arrives this fall, bringing people not used to bicycling to our downtown streets. SDOT will collect feedback and data on how it is operating, which will guide us as we move through the design of the Center City Bike Network and the development of permanent facilities.

### Be Super Safe!

When near a construction zone, please follow these safety guidelines:

- Reduce speeds
- Use caution
- Keep a safe distance from construction equipment and workers



### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Work hours will be 7:30 PM to 7:30 AM
- No parking or loading will be allowed in the work zone during work hours
- Construction noise and dust
- The current bike lane will be closed
- People biking will be detoured into the travel lane with motorists
- The travel lane next to the bike lane will be closed one block at a time while improvements are made
- Flaggers will guide motorists, people biking and people walking
