



Stairway reconstruction at W Armour St begins June 2016

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) crews are reconstructing the stairway at W Armour St and 15th Ave W to meet current accessibility standards.

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

Beginning as soon as early June, crews will begin preliminary work at the site, including detouring pedestrians around the stairway. Construction is expected to last approximately 2 months.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

As part of this rehabilitation work, crews will:

- Remove and replace the existing stairs with a 5-foot-wide staircase made of reinforced concrete that meets current City of Seattle standards
- Install new handrails on each side, with a second handrail at a lower height to accommodate adults and children
- Ensure all steps have uniform riser heights and tread widths

If the project budget allows, we'll also make some landscaping improvements.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

During stairway reconstruction, neighbors should expect:

- Stairway closure with detour in place
- Daytime construction activities between 7 AM and 3:30 PM
- Noisy work activities, including concrete breaking and backup alarms required for safety.
- No parking at bottom of stairway
