PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is hosting an open house to share plans to upgrade existing buffered bike lanes, build protected bike lanes, and improve intersections on NE Ravenna Blvd, Cowen Pl NE and the Cowen Park Bridge. At the north end of the Cowen Park Bridge, this project will install signs and markings to connect to the signed bike route on 20th Ave NE. Join us to help ensure the best project is built!


WHAT IS A PROTECTED BIKE LANE?

Protected bike lanes physically separate people riding bikes from people driving, using features like painted buffers and flexible plastic posts. They are distinct from the sidewalk and improve safety and

predictability for all travelers. Protected bike lanes are especially attractive to people who might be willing to bike, but are concerned about safety. They are one of many tools we can use to provide safer, more comfortable routes to get from one place to another and to help achieve our goal of zero traffic fatalities and serious traffic injuries.

- Give people more transportation options
- Expand protected bike lanes network across the city
