



Stairway replacement at 5th Ave W & W Dravus St begins as soon as August 15

PROJECT UPDATE

To improve pedestrian safety and accessibility, Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) crews are replacing the stairway at 5th Ave W & W Dravus St.

PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

Improvements include:

- Removing and replacing the existing stairs with a new staircase made of reinforced concrete, with even heights for each step
- Replacing the landings
- Installing new handrails on each side, with a second handrail at a lower height to accommodate adults and children

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

As early as August 15, the stairway will be fully closed. Stairway restoration is scheduled to take approximately 2 months to complete. Crews plan to reopen the stairway by October 2016.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

During stairway reconstruction, neighbors should expect:

- Daytime construction activities between 7 AM and 3:30 PM
- Noisy work activities including concrete breaking and backup alarms required for safety
- Parking restrictions at bottom and top of stairway during work

Thank you for your patience as we work to complete these improvements in your neighborhood.

Stairway improvements are funded by SDOT's general maintenance fund and the Levy to Move Seattle, approved by Seattle voters in 2015.
