

2003 Plant List: *Ajuga Reptans*, *Achillea* (yarrow), *Allium*, Blue Oat Grass, *Ceanothus* 'Weld Lilac', *Cerastium* 'Snow on Summer', Cosmos, Shasta Daisy, *Delphinium*, *Euphorbia* 'Spurge', *Fragaria Chiloensis* (evergreen strawberry), *Gladiolus*, *Hesperus matronalis* (white), German Iris, Day and Stella de Oro dwarf Lilies. Description: Drawing on the Admiral District’s views and proximity to the water, a native coastal planting palette was developed with the assistance of a professional landscape architect. Drought tolerant, vigorous garden varieties were used to minimize water requirements and maintenance, resist insects and disease, and quickly establish cover to eliminate weeds. A tanker truck service was hired to water the plants for the first 2 years, and spring and fall clean-ups are organized with flyers and mailings.

Plant List: *Acer truncatum x platanoides* ‘Norwegian Sunset’, *Ceanothus gloriosus* ‘Point Reyes’, *Pennisetum alopecuroides* ‘Hameln’, *Achillea* ‘Summer Pastels’, *Fragaria chiloensis*.
