



E Mercer Street and 24th Avenue E retaining wall replacement

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Beginning as soon as December 7, crews working for the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will replace a retaining wall in poor condition on the northwest corner of E Mercer St and 24th Ave E. The new wall will meet current seismic standards and be designed for a 75-year life.

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE AND IMPACTS

Construction is expected to be complete in early February, weather permitting. Work is *not* planned for nights, weekends or major holidays.

Parking restrictions

- Parking on a portion of E Mercer St will be restricted *throughout construction*
- Short-term parking restrictions will also affect a portion of 24th Ave E (for about one week)


Sidewalk impacts

- Pedestrians using the north sidewalk on E Mercer St between 23rd and 24th will be detoured to the south side
- Pedestrians using the west sidewalk on 24th Ave E between E Roy and E Mercer will be detoured to the east side

We will maintain access to residences.

Note: We plan to replace the adjoining retaining wall on 24th Ave E in spring 2016.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Daytime construction activities between 7 AM and 6 PM, Mon - Fri
- Noisy work, including jack hammering and backup alarms required for safety
- Construction equipment such as a drilling rig, excavator, dump trucks and concrete pump trucks
