ABOUT THE PROJECT

This Safe Routes to School (SRTS) project will make it safer and easier for kids to walk and bike in your neighborhood. This project was originally nominated for consideration as a way of improving connections for people walking and biking to and from Sanislo Elementary School. Funding for this project comes from the School Safety Traffic and Pedestrian Improvement Fund and the Levy to Move Seattle.

TIMING AND BENEFITS

We expect construction will begin in mid-2017.

These improvements will shorten crossing distances and organize the intersection so it's safer and smoother for people, walking, biking, and driving. Improvements include:

- New and widened sidewalks to improve walking connections to and from Sanislo Elementary School
- Curb extension at the northwest corner of 18th Ave SW and SW Orchard St
- Crosswalks to increase visibility of pedestrians
- ADA-compliant curb ramps for better accessibility
