Watershed School Programs

The Cedar River Watershed Education Center offers free education programs to schools and groups. These programs meet the Washington State K-12 Integrated Environmental and Sustainability Education Learning Standards.



REGISTRATION

All school programs are FREE. Sign-ups for Seeing the Source and Land and Water programs are based on a lottery registration process. Lottery applications for the following school year will be accepted between May first and August first of this year. Programs at a Glance

1 WATER IS MAGIC

This flexible self-led immersion explores water's many wonderful properties.

Field trips to the Water is Magic exhibits are available to any class or organized group. Options for a Naturalist-led introduction or extended program may be available. Participants travel through the water cycle, listen to stories of the past and present, and investigate the source of their drinking water. Reservations required for 10 or more.

2 SEEING THE SOURCE

Take a journey into the heart of the Cedar River Watershed on a Naturalist-led field trip to see the source of students' drinking water.

Hands-on activities encourage understanding of water cycles, watersheds, water quality, erosion, cultural history, riparian areas, and wildlife. Teachers must provide commercially licensed school buses or vans. Bus subsidies are available for Seattle Public Schools.

3 LAND AND WATER

Take a Naturalist-led journey to the Water is Magic exhibits and Rattlesnake Lake basin to explore the connections between land, water, and people.

Students take a closer look at nature through water testing and high quality microscopes. In the exhibit hall students travel through the water cycle, listen to stories of the past and present, and investigate the source of their drinking water.
