In-Water Soil Investigation Work near 24th Ave. NW Pier

PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION

Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) has hired a contractor to take soil samples in the water near the 24th Ave. NW street-end pier (see map below). Residents who live near the pier will see and hear drill rigs in the water at the locations shown below. Expect similar noise levels to soil testing performed at the SPU-owned Yankee Grill property earlier this fall, including engine noise from drill rigs, and intermittent hammering.


SCHEDULE

Work is scheduled to start as early as the week of December 7. Work hours will be from 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekdays. If needed, crews may work from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the weekends. The work is expected to last about two to three days per location, for a total duration of no more than two weeks.

ANTICIPATED IMPACTS

During and following construction, you can expect:

- Noise and vibration, including engine noise from drill rigs and intermittent hammering.
- Work vehicles at the SPU-owned Yankee Grill property.
- Crews working onsite during weekday, daytime hours.
- No anticipated impacts to vehicle or pedestrian access to the 24th Ave. NW street end during work. Boats will not be able to moor on the 24th Ave. NW pier during this work. Boats on the adjacent private piers will not need to move.
