

What will I see today?



Where are we in the rebuild process?


Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) formed a stakeholder group of station users and community members in 2008 to provide more detailed input for the design of a new transfer station. The stakeholder group and SPU have recently been working through the conceptual design process and last month the stakeholder group narrowed the concepts down to two, Concept A and Concept B.

We are here today to present you with information about each concept and receive your input. On May 16, the stakeholder group will recommend which concept will move forward. Their recommendation will consider input received today and through other community outreach.

Station 4: Architectural Treatments

View and learn about proposed architectural and design elements, and give feedback on the final design.

Station 5: Amenities Brainstorm

Participate in identifying ideas for amenities for SPU to consider going forward into the design process.
