Roosevelt Reservoir out-of-service period extended until 2017

*Seattle Public Utilities continues to conduct
citywide seismic study on drinking water system*

PROJECT / DESCRIPTION OF WORK:

Roosevelt Reservoir, located at NE 75th Street and 12th Avenue, in the Roosevelt neighborhood, was taken out of service in April 2013 for a two-year decommissioning test. The test was to evaluate whether the reservoir could be permanently removed from Seattle's drinking water distribution system.

During this test period Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) also initiated a seismic evaluation to look at how well the City's entire drinking water distribution system would perform in a large earthquake. Water storage for both drinking water and fire flow will be an important aspect of this study, and the potential water storage in the Roosevelt Reservoir in a post-earthquake scenario will be considered.

The results from the seismic study have been delayed due to additional analysis needed and are now expected in mid-2017. At that time, SPU will have the critical information it needs to decide the future use of Roosevelt Reservoir, and whether it could declare the property surplus to its drinking water utility system. If SPU were to proceed with property surplus, the City of Seattle would conduct a thorough process to determine the best future use of the property. This process would include many opportunities for public involvement and feedback.

Until the seismic study is complete and a decision is made about the reservoir, it is important to note that SPU is not conducting any community planning activities to identify future use(s) of the property. At this time, SPU is focused on conducting a complete and thorough evaluation of Roosevelt Reservoir.
