If your pet is altered (spayed or neutered), you must submit proof of surgery with this application and your check for payment.

A provisional license may be issued for dogs and cats up to 6 months of age to allow time for the animal to be spayed or neutered. A provisional tag may also be issued for cats and dogs of any age that were not previously licensed with the City of Seattle if proof of spay or neuter is unavailable at the time of licensing. Each pet is limited to a single provisional license valid for one six-month period.

SENIOR CITIZEN/DISABLED PERSONS DISCOUNT of 50% on license fees is available for citizens 60 and over or disabled persons. You must have a City of Seattle Gold Card for Healthy Aging or a Disability Card issued by the Mayor's Office to qualify. Seattle Municipal Code, Section 9.25.050 requires that all cats, dogs, potbelly pigs, and miniature goats be licensed.

A SEATTLE PET LICENSE

- Gives your pet a Free Ride Home should he or she be impounded. Although the standard redemption fees still apply, officers make every effort to return licensed animals to their owners while in the field. This prevents you and your pet from having to come to the animal shelter!
- Helps link up finders of lost animals with pet owners without your pet making a visit to the animal shelter.
- Allows you to notify Seattle Animal Shelter when you are on vacation and someone else is caring for your pet. Simply call Seattle Pet Licensing at (206) 386-4262 and let us know how long you will be gone and who to contact should your pet be found. Pet license staff will note this on your pet licensing record.
- Helps veterinarians contact pet owners should your pet become injured and be in need of life saving medical treatment.

BE A RESPONSIBLE PET OWNER. SPAY OR NEUTER YOUR PET!

The estimated U.S. cat population is 75 million. Of this, 15 million are strays. Starting with one fertile female cat, she and her offspring may produce 12,000 cats in just five years and 80 million cats in 10 years. For dogs (who don't have as many litters each year), the numbers are still staggering. One dog and her litters produce more than 4000 puppies in seven years. The bottom line - there aren't enough homes for them all! Seattle

Animal Shelter has a low cost, high quality spay and neuter clinic. Anyone is eligible to use the clinic to have their dog or cat spayed or neutered. Please call (206) 386-4260 to schedule an appointment for your pet's surgery. The clinic is open Monday through Friday and is located at the north end of the Seattle Animal Shelter. Financial assistance is available to pet owners in need.

DID YOU KNOW?

Seattle Animal Shelter has four funds set up to receive charitable contributions for helping animals? Your contributions may be tax deductible (consult your tax advisor). You may donate online at www.seattleanimalshelter.org or enclose your donation with this application. So when you're considering donating to a worthy cause, consider...

- 1) **"Help The Animals Fund"** - This fund was established in 1977 to receive gifts and donations for the purpose of promoting animal welfare. Your contributions could be used for such activities as promoting responsible pet ownership, purchasing toys and treats for animals at the shelter, providing animal carriers for low income or elderly persons, or providing extraordinary veterinary care for animals that have been subject to animal abuse or in need of medical attention through our foster care program.
- 2) **"Pet Population Control Fund"** - This fund was established in 1996 to receive donations for the purpose of promoting pet population control through Seattle's low cost municipal spay and neuter clinic. Donations may be used to pay for the spaying and neutering of pets owned by low income or elderly persons, promote public awareness about the benefits and importance of spaying and neutering, or to purchase new spay and neuter technology that the clinic may not otherwise be able to obtain.
- 3) **"Shelter Expansion Fund"** - This expansion will add 4,600 square feet of space to the existing shelter and will provide room for such activities as volunteer orientations, training, indoor dog obedience classes, regional animal welfare meetings, and coordination of off-site adoption events. Seattle Animal Shelter currently has over 600 volunteers participating in eighteen programs and this new space will allow the Shelter staff and volunteers to continue to enhance the programs and services provided to the community.
- 4) **"Off Leash Area Fund"** - This fund was established in 1996 for the sole purpose of creating, maintaining and providing amenities for off-leash areas here in Seattle. For more information on the location of off-leash areas, please call (206) 386-PETS.
