Black Life: A Seattle Perspective

Celebrate Black history month and hear one of Seattle's most esteemed historians, Esther H. Mumford. She will share stories on the contributions of Blacks to the growth of Washington State. A founder of the Black Heritage Society of Washington State, Mumford traces her interest to oral histories she researched as a State Archivist in the mid 70's. In the late 80's, she was designated a Washington Living Treasure in recognition of her significant contributions to the state's ethnic and cultural heritage.
