Rule 15 Monetary thresholds

Pursuant to SMC 2.04.090.F, the Commission hereby finds that the reporting thresholds in SMC 2.04.165 (which have never been revised since this section was added to the Elections Code in 1999) are, in light of changes to reporting enacted with the passage of Initiative 122 in 2015 required by state law and inflation, too lowno longer accurate.

The following thresholds are consistent with those on the F-1, which elected officials and candidates file with the Public Disclosure Commissionenacted in 2015.
