About the Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission

The Commission is a seven-member, citizen body that interprets, administers and enforces the Seattle Elections Code, Ethics Code, Election Pamphlet Code, Lobbying Code, and Whistleblower Protection Code. Three members are appointed by the Mayor; three are appointed by the City Council and the seventh is appointed by the other six. All seven are confirmed by the City Council. The term of office for a commissioner is three years.

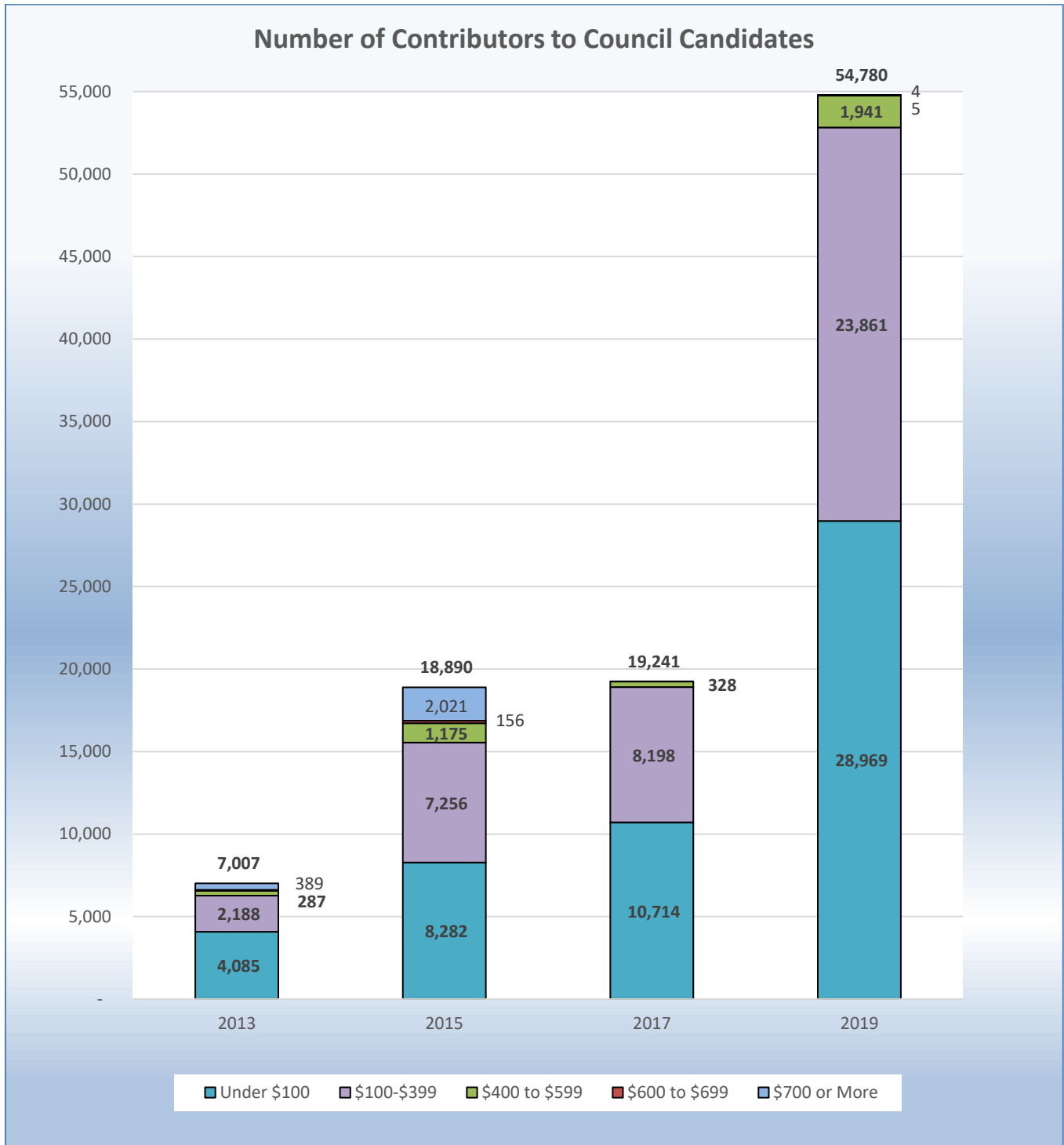

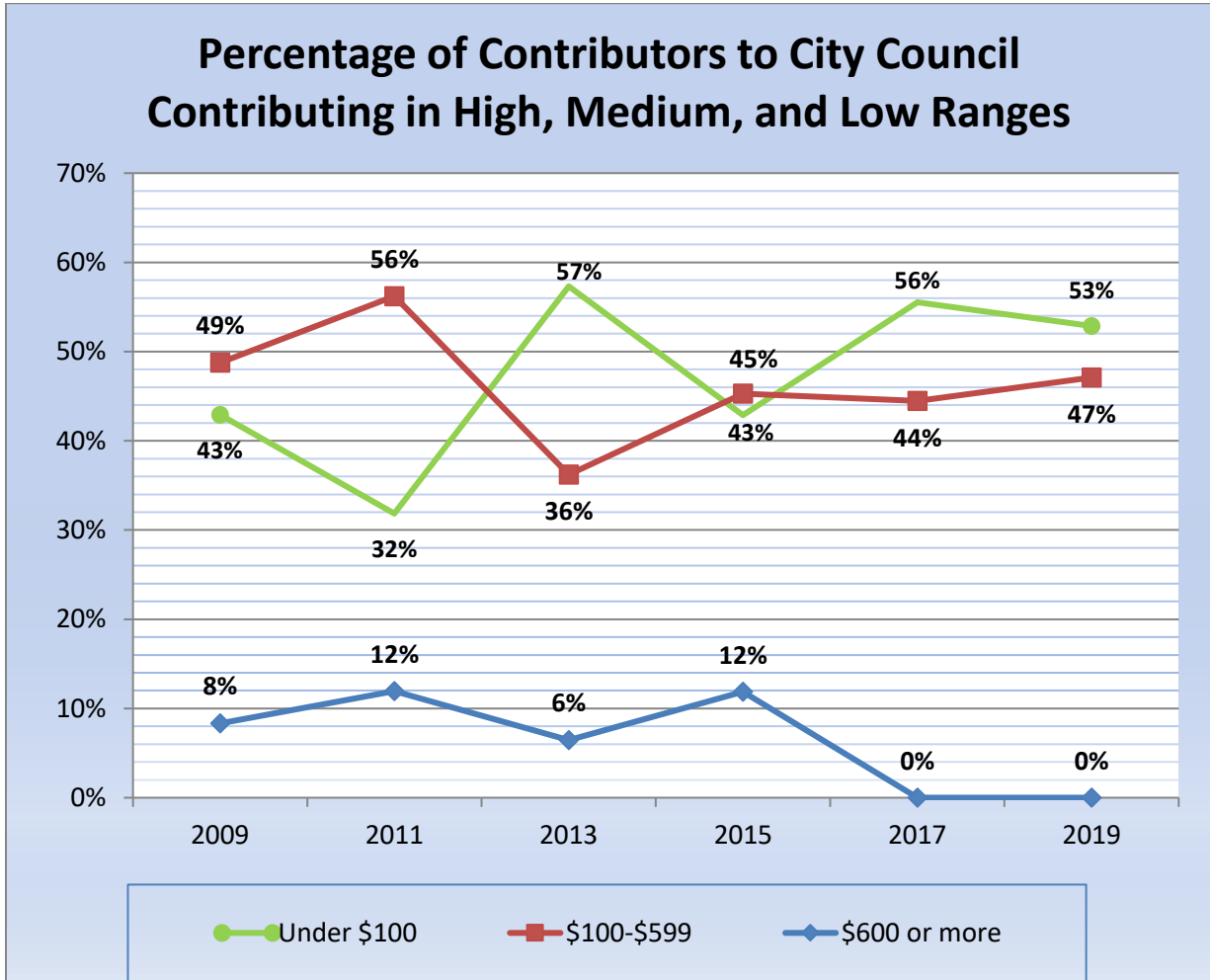
Number of Contributors by Contribution Range

It was another record-breaking year for the number of contributors to Council campaigns, with almost 55,000 persons making contributions. Note that a person who contributed \$75 each to two candidates is counted as two contributors in the “Under \$100” range, not one contributor in the “\$100 to 399” range.



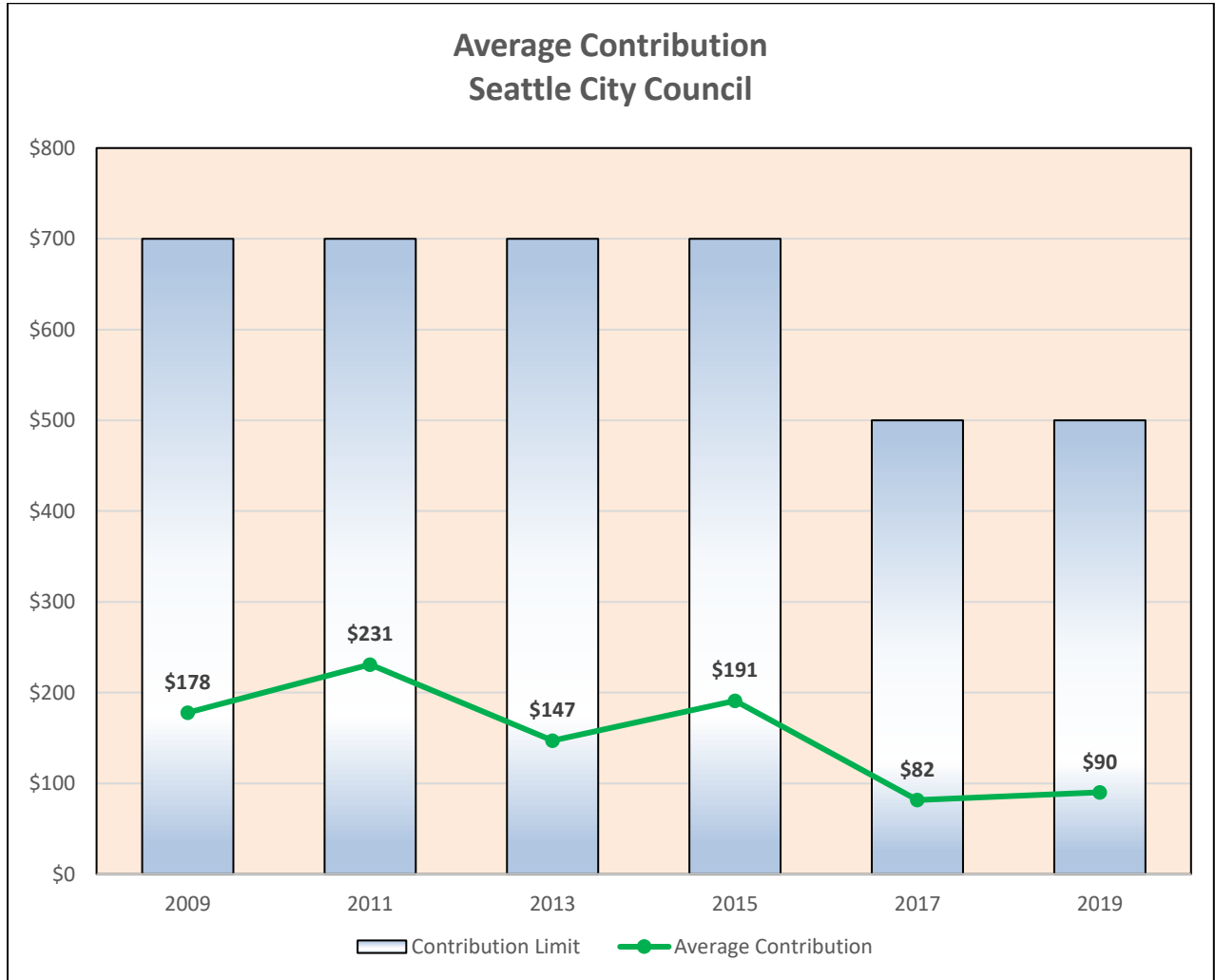
Percentage of Contributors Contributing Amounts in High, Medium, Low Ranges

Average Contribution Amount

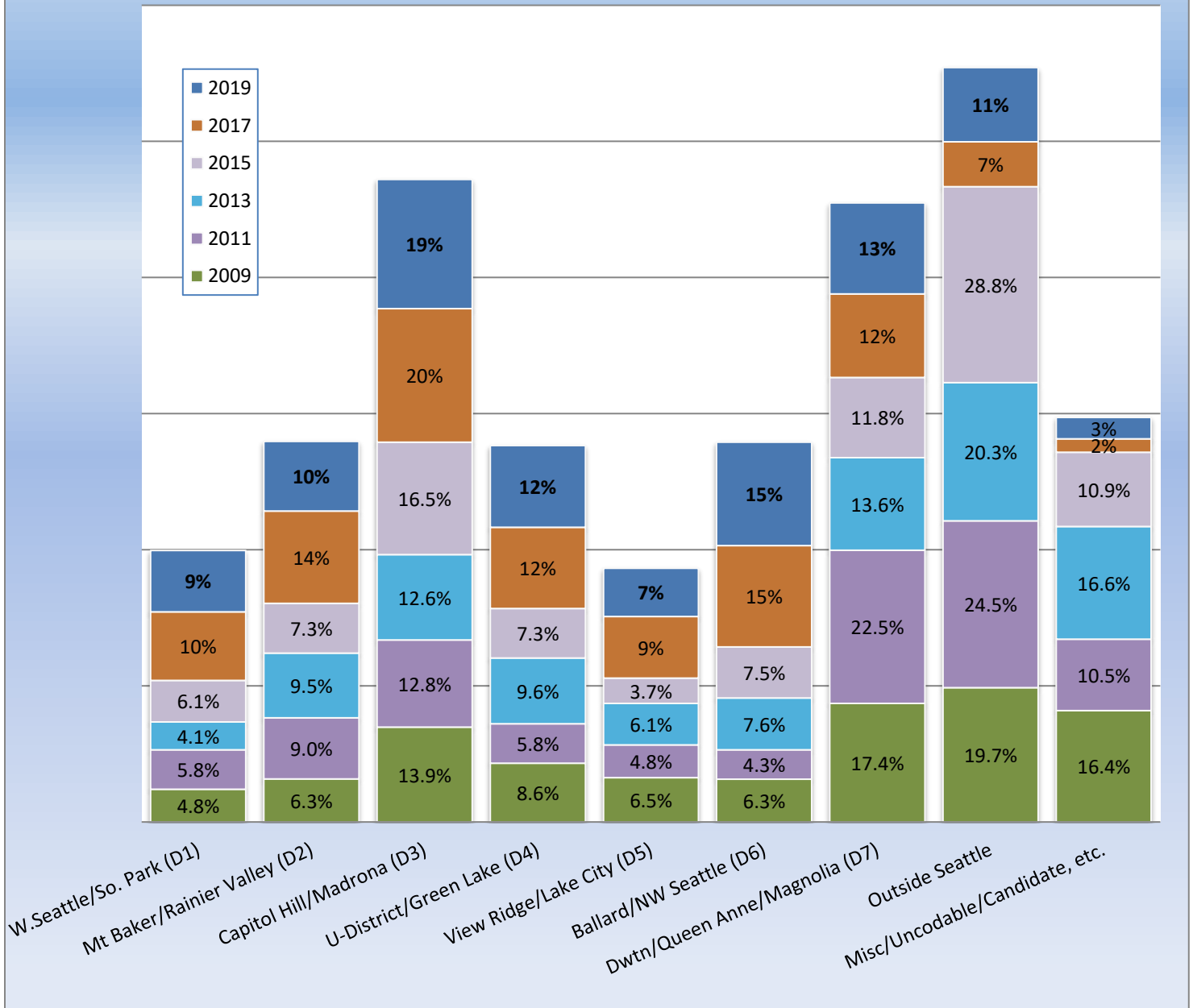
For the second straight election cycle, the average contribution remained at levels not seen in almost 30 years.



Geographic Distribution of Contributors

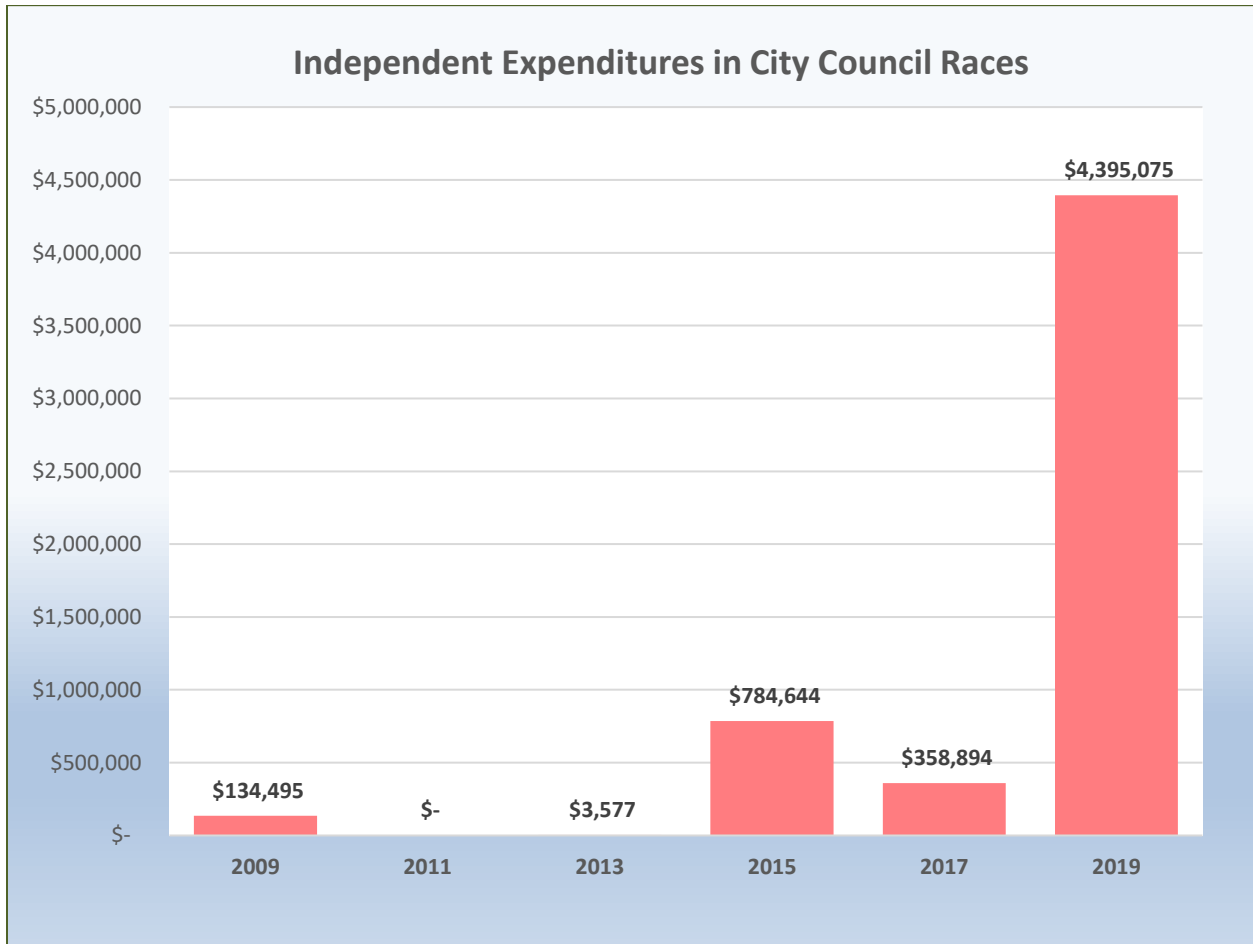
The percentage of contributors residing in Seattle was again close to 90% of all contributors, after hovering between 70 and 80% prior to the debut of the Democracy Voucher Program.

Independent expenditures soared in 2019, dwarfing previous records. Two thirds of the independent spending was spent on behalf of candidates who did not prevail in November.
