3	WHEREAS, OPCD is proposing five ordinances that together implement the land use strategies				
4	recommended by the Industrial and Maritime Strategy Council and were studied in the				
5	Industrial and Maritime Strategy Environmental Impact Statement and includes an				
6	ordinance amending Seattle's Comprehensive Plan to create a new land use policy				
7	framework, an amendment to the Seattle Municipal Code to establish new industrial

"Commercial District" includes zones designated as NC2, NC3, SM, SM-SLU, SM-D, 6 SM-NR, C1, C2, DOC1, DOC2, DRC, DMC, PSM, IDM, DH1, DH2, PMM, ((and)) IB, and UI 7 in ((the Land Use Code of the City of Seattle,)) Title 23. 8 C. Section 25.08.410 of the Seattle Municipal Code, last amended by Ordinance 15 122923, is amended as follows: 16 25.08.410 ((-)) Exterior sound level limits((-)) 17 A. The exterior sound level limits are based on the Leq during the measurement interval, 18 using a minimum measurement interval of ((4)) one minute for a constant sound source, or a 19 one-hour measurement for a non-continuous sound source.
