
South Delridge Community Planning



About This Project

Situated in West Seattle, the South Delridge community is made up of several neighborhoods, such as Roxhill, Westwood, and Highland Park. South Delridge is a culturally diverse community with commercial areas that serve West Seattle and White Center.

Community members in the area last completed a vision and accompanying policies to help shape the growth and investment in their neighborhood over 20 years ago. For many years, community members have expressed a desire to update their vision.

This community planning process includes the Westwood-Highland Park Urban Village, and the surrounding South Delridge areas where people gather, shop, seek services, and recreate, that are important to communities living in the planning area. An exact planning area is being determined through the initial engagement process.

What's Happening Now?

City of Seattle's Office of Planning and Community Development (OPCD) is working to develop partnerships with community organizations and City departments to elevate community voices, and connect them with City departments who will collaborate on this project.

Outcomes

This project will create a shared community-City vision and an action plan that builds community assets and capacity, and aligns City investments in to achieve this vision.


Get Involved

South Delridge Action Plan (bit.ly/SouthDelridgeActionPlan)

OPCD will engage community members to create a shared vision and an action plan that builds community capacity for equitable development, and aligns City investments to achieve this vision.

North Delridge Action Plan (bit.ly/NorthDelridgeActionPlan)

OPCD completed a Community Planning process in 2018 and published the North Delridge Action Plan. The document outlines six priority areas:

- 1. Supporting Diverse & Engaged Communities
- 2. Developing Dynamic Neighborhood Destinations
- 3. Improving Access to Affordable, Healthy Food
- 4. Creating Active Transportation Choices
- 5. Nurturing a Healthy Longfellow Creek Watershed
- 6. Leveraging Parks & Cultural Facilities to Support a Healthy Community

Coordinated Efforts

City departments will collaborate across multiple projects to gather your feedback and make sure that the outcomes of these projects address the community needs and priorities outlined in the action plans for North Delridge and South Delridge.

West Seattle and Ballard Link Extensions (WSBLE) Delridge Station Area Planning (Seattle.gov/lightrail)

Station location will be selected in 2023, and scheduled to open in 2032. Unlike the typical Station Area that corresponds to a 10-min walk from the stop, Delridge's station area will be the transit access area outline by the two frequent bus routes.

Equitable Transit Oriented Development (ETOD)

OPCD is supporting a Black, Indigenous, People of Color community-guided process to plan for what development without displacement can look like around Delridge and other light rail stations. This process centers on building community power, community land ownership, affordable housing and other community benefits, safe and efficient ways to get around, a healthy environment, and ensuring economic benefits come to community members.

NEA Grant - Creative Placekeeping for WSBLE

Department of Neighborhoods is participating in a National Endowment for the Arts grant project to fund youth-led engagement on creative placekeeping for West Seattle and Ballard Link Extensions (WSBLE). Delridge Neighborhood Development Association (DNDA) is the community partner.
