	majority of the first loop, the South Loop, was completed in 2022 and the remainder is under construction. The proposal is to construct a 1.0-mile, one-way bike trail, a 0.4-mile multi-use trail, and a 0.1-mile pedestrian-only connector trail through a segment of Cheasty Greenspace and a publicly accessible parcel owned by Seattle Housing Authority, accessed from Cheasty Boulevard to the west and South Adams Street to the east. The trail will be three to four feet wide, predominantly constructed on native soils with some import of materials. Trail construction will be done by hand and using small, mechanized equipment. Trail clearing width varies depending on location. Cleared areas will be restored with native vegetation post construction. No exceptional trees will be removed during the proposed construction. There are identified Environmentally Critical Areas – Steep Slope, Potential and Known Slide Areas, Wetland and Wildlife Habitat located on the site.
