SUBJECT: Bias Crime and Bias Incidents Synopsis - (1st Half 2020 dates 01/01/20-06/30/20)

#### Overview

During the first half of 2019, **359** criminal and non-criminal bias-based incidents were reported to the Seattle Police Department. This compares to **229** bias-based incidents reported in the first half of 2019. This reflects a 6% (-15) decrease of bias-based incidents, city-wide.

During the first half of 2019, Malicious harassment cases decreased by 6 (-11%%), the category of crimes with bias elements decreased by 3 (-3%), and non-criminal bias incidents decreased by 6 (-7%) from the same reporting period in 2018.

Reported **anti-LGBTQ** malicious harassment cases numbered 13 during the first half of 2019 and increased to 15 during the first half of 2020. Anti-LGBTQ crimes with bias elements numbered 29 in 2019, and 39 in 2020. Non-criminal bias incidents also fell from 16 in 2019 to 13 in 2020.

Reported **anti-Black** malicious harassment cases numbered 13 during the first half of 2018 and remained at 13 the first half of 2019. Reported anti-Black crimes with bias elements increased from 31 reported incidents during the first half of 2018 to 36 during the first half of 2019. There were 24 anti-Black non-criminal bias incidents in the first half of 2019, down from 35 in 2018 during the same period.

Most reported incidents occurred during second watch and third watch (91 each watch), followed by first watch (47).

**East Precinct** had the most incidents, accounting for 30% (69) of the total number city wide, followed by **West Precinct** at 28% (65) and **North Precinct** at 18% (40). **South Precinct** reported 14% (33) of incidents, followed by **Southwest Precinct** at 10% (22).

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## <u>Incidents</u>

- ✓ 49 were determined to be Malicious Harassment
- ✓ 102 of the incidents were determined to be crimes with bias elements
- ✓ 78 of the incidents were determined to be non-criminal bias incidents

### <u>Arrests</u>

49 malicious harassment cases resulted in 19 arrests:

- o 11 were arrested and/or charged with a felony crime
- o 8 were arrested and/or charged with a misdemeanor offense
- 30 cases were inactivated or administratively cleared due to solvability or other factors

102 crimes with bias elements cases resulted in 44 arrests:

- o 7 were arrested and/or charged with a felony crime
- o 36 were arrested and/or charged with a misdemeanor offense
- o 1 case was cleared exceptional- the victim did not want to press charges after a suspect was taken into custody
- 58 cases were inactivated or administratively cleared due to solvability or other factors

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## **Bias Categories**

Perpetrators in bias-based events targeted 21 total groups with the two most frequently reporting groups, anti-black and anti-gay/lesbian, accounting for 54% of the total number of bias-based incidents.

- The category of Anti-Black represents 31% of the total reported incidents.
- The aggregated categories of Anti-Gay, Lesbian, Bi-Sexual, Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming represents **26%** percent of the incidents.
- ➤ 20% of the criminal and non-criminal bias incidents occurred during 1<sup>st</sup> watch hours (0300-1159)
- ➤ 40% of the criminal and non-criminal bias incidents occurred during 2nd watch hours (1200-1959)

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➤ 40% of the criminal and non-criminal bias incidents occurred during 3<sup>rd</sup> watch hours (2000-0259)

David Sector represents 25% of the total crimes and 38% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the West Precinct.

King Sector **41%** of the total crimes and **33%** of the non-criminal bias incidents in the West Precinct.

Mary Sector represents 27% of the total crimes and 19% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the West Precinct.

Queen Sector represents 7% of the total crimes and 10% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the West Precinct.

Sam Sector represents 40% of the crimes and 31% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the South Precinct.

Ocean Sector represents 5% of the total crimes and 8% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the South Precinct.

Edward Sector represents **56%** of the total crimes and **59%** of the non-criminal bias incidents in the East Precinct.

Charlie Sector represents 21% of the total crimes and 29% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the East Precinct.

George Sector represents 23% of the total crimes and 12% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the East Precinct.

Lincoln Sector represents 24% of the total crimes and 7% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the North Precinct.

Union Sector represents 12% of the total crimes and 33% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the North Precinct.

John Sector represents 8% of the total crimes and 33% of the non-criminal bias incidents in the North Precinct.
