- Repeat and Vulnerable Victims









Residential Burglary - Secure Parking 2015 YTD



FIREARMS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY


Firearms Taken into Custody January 1 to June 30 (2010-2015)

Firearms taken into custody include: civilian turn-ins; surrenders; found property; and criminal investigations.




CITYWIDE SHOTS FIRED

Shots Fired Count by Year January 1 to July 6 (2012-2015)




Shots Fired Resulting in Injury or Death January 1 to July 6 (2014 and 2015)




