#### Background



#### East Link Final Environmental Impact Statement

Home / Get to know us / Documents & reports / East Link Final Environmental Impact Statement

- Of all East Link stations, Judkins Park likely to generate most "hide and ride" impacts
- Sound Transit (ST) to inventory parking conditions prior to opening within ¼ mile
- ST and SDOT will work together with stakeholders to identify and implement mitigation, which could include parking meters, restricted parking zones (RPZ), load zones, and promotion of alternative transportation



#### **Study Area**

- Green is ¼ mile (S Charles St to S Grand St, 17<sup>th</sup> Ave S to 23<sup>rd</sup> Ave S)
- Blue is ½ mile area SDOT supported as supplement (S Jackson St to S College St, 15<sup>th</sup> Ave S to 30<sup>th</sup> Ave S)
- 2022 data provides baseline of *existing* parking supply, regulations and occupancy, along with noting adjacent land uses
- Occupancy data 4 AM, 10 AM, 2 PM, 8 PM weekday, Saturday 10 AM and 2 PM

• Being finalized by consultant - available late 2022

#### **Restricted Parking Zone Proposal Approach**

- Propose in areas likely to be affected by station opening
- Consider if time limits and/or load zones are more appropriate in densest areas
- Review zoning and pipeline developments





#### How do RPZs work?

- Permits exempt residents from time limit
- Other vehicles generally subject to 2hour time limit
- •4 decal permits, 1 guest permit per household
- Currently \$65/permit for two-year cycle
- Income eligible permit available (\$10)





### **Potential New RPZs for Hide and Ride Mitigation**

#### Would accomplish:

 Remove legal ability for vehicles without permits to park all day on weekdays on residential streets, discouraging new "hide and ride" parkers



#### Would not accomplish:

- Provide guaranteed parking for residents
- Address existing / future resident parking congestion

Date	Action
Q4 2022	Finalize occupancy report, develop initial curbspace proposal
Q1 2023	Publish initial draft of curbspace proposal, distribute with survey and provide additional outreach and feedback opportunities
Q3-Q4 2023	Draft curbspace proposal and RPZ-specific public hearing
2024	Final plan and implementation, light rail opens
