Critical Habitat *

Individual critical habitat for each species may overlap. The colors below can indicate critical habitat for more than one species.

- Southern Resident Killer Whale
- Killer Whale & Chinook
- Killer Whale, Chinook & Bull Trout
- Chinook & Bull Trout

For marine waters only, critical habitat extends to a depth of 98 feet (30 m) for chinook salmon, and 32 feet (10 m) for bull trout relative to mean lower low water (MLLW), and from a minimum depth of 20 feet (6.1 m) relative to extreme high water (EHW) for killer whales.
