Engaging community

Value of Seattle's urban forest

725 Metric Tons of Pollutants removed annually by our trees, saving \$5.62 million

\$5.9 Million IN AVOIDED ENERGY COSTS by providing shade in the summer & blocking wind in the winter

\$10.9 Million in savings from

CARBON STORAGE + \$768,000 annual savings from carbon sequestration = \$11.7M saved on carbon storage and sequestration - helping reduce climate change impacts

Initiatives and Programs

Green Seattle Partnership

Restoring more than 2,700 acres of forested parkland through volunteer and professional crew work to remove invasive plants, plant new native trees and understory plants, and perform long term maintenance.

Trees for Neighborhoods

Providing 1,000 free trees every year and support for Seattle residents to plant in their yards.

Tree Ambassador

Supporting volunteers in caring for Seattle's public trees and engaging neighbors in tours of Seattle's aweinspiring urban forest.

Heritage Tree Program

Recognizing special trees to be celebrated as part of Seattle's Heritage.

Urban Forestry Commission

Advising Mayor and City Council on the establishment of policy and regulations governing the protection, management, and conservation of trees and vegetation in Seattle.
