

Conservation group reaches deal to buy Wayne Golf Course
The group has reached a deal to purchase the 300-acre Wayne Golf Course in Bothell, a deal that would preserve the course as a public park. The group, led by the Forterra group, has been in negotiations with the city of Bothell for several months. The deal would allow the city to maintain the course as a public park, while the Forterra group would own the land. The deal is a significant victory for the conservation group, as it would prevent the course from being developed into residential or commercial property.



Aggressive non-native vegetation will dominate the urban forest unless removed. In 100 years, the trees will be gone. City officials estimate that potentially billions of dollars in services such as stormwater control will be lost.






The Green Cities Network




Green Cities Instigation (DTR)


