READY TO PARTICIPATE? HERE'S HOW:

1. Sign up as an employer at seattle.launchpath.com/Account/Registeremployer
2. Post your position(s) online no later than **May 1, 2017**. Internship positions must meet the following requirements:
 - Paid Minimum Wage
 - 8 Week Commitment (180 hours is recommended)
 - Offers an environment conducive to training and learning
 - Designated supervisor willing to attend program training
 - Work Permit acquired for any interns under 18
3. Your supervisors receive:
 - In-person and online trainings to create an effective internship experience
 - Customized support to develop internship responsibilities and activities
4. Your organization is matched with pre-screened youth ages 16 - 24 currently enrolled in an employment training program. You will meet young people who are interested in your industry and are ready to learn and work.
5. Internships begin **July 5, 2017**

WHAT IS THE MAYOR'S YOUTH EMPLOYMENT INITIATIVE?

- Ensure young people ages **16-24** in our community gain **critical work experience & career exposure**
- Create **equitable** career pathways in our community

LAST SUMMER:

- 670 young people received a paid summer job opportunity and employment training support
- For 35% this was their first job
- 87% were young people of color, 57% were female



WHAT DOES A SUCCESSFUL INTERNSHIP PROGRAM LOOK LIKE?

2016 Internship Supervisor Panel

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- ❑ Paid Minimum Wage (Budget \$2,700 - \$3,100 per intern, depending on hourly wage)
Non-profits and small businesses are eligible for city funding that covers up to 150 hours of wages and support services
- ❑ 7 Week Commitment (20 - 25 hours per week)
- ❑ Offer an environment conducive to training and learning
- ❑ Designated Supervisor
- ❑ Work Permit acquired for any interns under 18

SUPERVISOR SUPPORT

- ❑ Training to create an effective internship experience
- ❑ Your organization is matched with pre-screened youth ages 16 - 24 currently enrolled in an employment training program

TIMELINE AND KEY DATES

May 1	Deadline to Register Online & Submit Complete Job Description
June 2-23	Intern onboarding as determined by your Worksite Coordinator
July 5	Internships Start
August 11	Internship Capstone Event
August 15	Last Day of Internships

HOW TO REGISTER

1. Identify a Worksite Coordinator. The Worksite Coordinator is a staff member (preferably full-time) at your organization who is the primary communication contact for the Initiative.
2. Worksite Coordinator registers as an Employer in our system by visiting seattle.launchpath.com
3. Create an Organizational Profile with basic information about your organization.
4. Post an internship opportunity!
