

Looking back on the last several months of HALA work, there are many accomplishments. Thank you for your input, your time and thank you for continuing to support the Seattle Housing Levy. It's obvious that Seattleites want an affordable city for all.

#### Some highlights are:

- Seattlevoters renewed and expanded the Seattle Housing Levy
- The following addition tenant protections wereput into place: Source of Income Discrimination, Improvement of Tenants Rights, Tenant Relocation Assistance
- Multifamily Tax Exemption was expanded toallow for the construction of more affordable housing, especiallyfamily-sized homes.
- Thecommunity has made important contributions to the development of Mandatory Housing Affordability Residential Framework
