March 2, 2015 Number 7

The City of Seattle is committed to being a safe, vibrant, interconnected, and affordable city.

Week Overview

Final cut-off for bills in committee this week had legislators scrambling to complete hearings in fiscal committees and move legislation to Rules. Media sites have reported that over 2,200 bills have been introduced to date in this session. However, most of the focus of the week revolved around the Senate's proposed transportation package, a series of 11 bills that made up a comprehensive approach to spending, revenue-raising and reforms that moved out of the Ways and Means committee and onto the Senate floor. More on this package and vote in the Transportation section of this report.

With committee cut-off behind them, legislators move to the chamber floors to debate bills, with an eye on March 11th, the last days for legislation to move out of its house of origin.

Priority Areas

Budget and Infrastructure

Title-only bills on the budget were introduced this week; Senate bills <u>SB 6049</u> and <u>SB 6070</u>; and House bills <u>HB 2168</u> to <u>HB 2180</u>. These are place holders for the lead budget writers to have a bill number of record. The House will release its budget first this year, with some leaders indicating a release date at the end of March. Debate continues between the two sides of the aisle over the need for new revenue.

Education

The Senate Ways and Means Committee held a hearing on Sen. Jamie Pedersen's (D) bill to alter the School Construction Formula, <u>SB 5859</u>. Noting that Seattle alone has added 7,000 new students in the past 5 years and is projected to be roughly 60,000 total in 2020, while the formula has not changed since the 90's, Sen. Pedersen and others called attention to the need to account for actual costs and space needs that the current formula doesn't address. The bill has 35 sponsors and is considered necessary to implement the budget (NTIB).

Legislation known as the "Early Start Act" continues to move forward in both chambers, with bills <u>SSB</u> 5452 and <u>SHB 1491</u> being voted out of their respective committee and on to Rules on Friday. The intent of the legislation is for early intervention through integrating childcare and preschool. The legislation has a clause that makes it null and void if appropriations are not allocated.

Safety Net, Housing and Health Care

Several bills important to the City in this area, such as tenant screening and relocation, voters' rights, minimum wage and sick and safe leave, and equal pay, were included in a Rules Committee "package pull" on Friday by House Leadership. It is expected that several of these will have floor votes this week in the House.

Environment

Amid continued questions of the State's preparedness to respond in the event of an accident involving trains carrying hazardous materials (particularly oil), and concerns from Republican lawmakers that the proposed taxes to fund such a response are disproportionately high to the need, the Finance committee passed Rep. Jessyn Farrell's (D) "oil safety" bill, HB 1449, out of committee and to Rules.

Transportation

As noted in the Overview, the Senate's proposed transportation package has been moving forward. On the morning of Friday, February 27th, Republicans brought all 11 bills to the floor for a vote, with the intent to complete action on all components. Five of the first 7 "reform" bills passed almost unanimously, including SB 5993 which included an amendment negotiated with Labor that resolved some of the more contentions labor policy reforms in the original bill. The other two (SB 5991 and 5994) passed on party line votes over the concerns of Democrats about environmental impacts.

Of particular concern to the City, however, was an issue that arose during consideration of the 8th bill, SB 5990. Already a concern for many legislators due to the shift of construction-project sales revenues from the General Fund to the Transportation Fund, the bill became more problematic when an amendment by Sen. Erisksen (R) was added that would eliminate all state and local sales taxes on transportation projects. A similar amendment had been defeated when the bill was considered in committee. On the Senate floor, however, the amendment was accepted on a voice vote and the substitute bill passed on a party line vote.

Following SB 5990, the Senate then moved to consider SB 5987, which concerned transportation revenue. Democrats made several attempts to amend the bill, offering amendments to give full authority to Sound Transit to raise \$15 billion through 3 proposed revenue sources; and an amendment to fully fund the Safe Routes to School program. Both failed. An amendment by Sen. Sharon Nelson (D) would have struck the entire bill and replaced it with a "clean version", one that removed restrictions on the Governor to implement a Low Carbon Fuels Standard. This also was defeated on a roll call vote of 26-23. Finally, the Democrats challenged the bill on the grounds that it was subject to a new rule, imposed by the Senate on the first day of session, that all "new" taxes required a 2/3 vote. In order for the Lt. Governor to have time to consider this challenge the Senate put off further deliberation and "adjourned" until Monday at 10 am.

The following is a list of the 11 bills and their status:

- <u>SB 5987</u> Transportation revenue consideration was put on hold as the democrats challenged that the rule adopted on the first day of session requiring a 2/3 vote for "new" taxes applied to this legislation. Action will continue on Monday at 10am beginning with the Lt Governor's ruling on the challenge.
- Senator Frockt (D) sponsored an important amendment for the City that was adopted to help us implement our VLF rebate program.
- <u>SB 5990</u> Sales tax amendment was adopted that changes the already proposed tax shift on transportation projects from the General Fund to transportation, to a complete tax exemption on all sales taxes, including local taxes, for transportation projects. The amended bill passed 25-23.
- <u>SB 5991</u> Sweeping 20% of the funds in the ELSA account to fund storm water. Passed 27-22.
- <u>SB 5592</u> Modifying requirements for ferry vessel construction. Passed 48-1.
- <u>SB 5993</u> Concerning Public Works project contracting. Original bill was amended on a striker that was negotiated with labor to address proposed labor policy changes, including prevailing wage. Striker passed 48-1.
- SB 5994 Establishing a new permitting process on transportation projects. Passed 30-19.
- SB 5995 Adding "congestion relief and freight mobility" to transportation policy goals. Passed 49-0.
- SB 5996 Streamlining the EIS process. Passed 47-2.
- SB 5997 Establishing a design-build review panel. Passed 49-0.

Public Safety

Two companion bills, <u>SB 5957</u> sponsored by Sen. Marko Liias (D), and <u>HB 2127</u> by Rep. Farrell, would establish a pedestrian fatality and serious injury review panel. Both bills passed out of their respective Transportation committees, with a unanimous vote in the Senate and a primarily party line vote in the House.

Public Records

SHB 1086, sponsored by Rep. Jim Moeller (D), allowing cost recovery for commercial purpose public records requests, received a hearing in House Appropriations Committee, but appears not to have moved on. However, SHB 1684, sponsored by Rep. Dean Takko (D), which addresses cost recovery on electronic or scanned records requests, was referred to Rules on an 18-15 party line vote.

Marijuana

<u>SB 5052</u>, an omnibus medical marijuana bill sponsored by Sen. Ann Rivers (R), is scheduled for a hearing in the House Healthcare and Wellness Committee on Thursday, March 5th. Meanwhile, Rep. Rueven Carlyle (D) has introduced <u>HB 2136</u>, a title-only bill that is expected to focus on reforms to the recreational market. This bill will be heard Wednesday, March 4th.

Looking Ahead

Action moves to the Chamber floors this week as bills are taken up by the full body in advance of the March 11th deadline.

Monday should see the resumption of consideration of the remaining components of the Senate Transportation package, as the Lt. Governor's ruling is expected that morning.
