



# Intro to policy framework and performance measures



## Create a clear and consistent policy framework





## Policy framework definitions



Performance Measure

A clear and inspirational description of long-term change (**desired end state**) that provides a compelling, conceptual image; the dreaming (**aspirational**) piece of how we will change our community

A statement that defines the destination, **overall purpose**, or **ultimate aim**; a broad statement of desired long-term results

A statement of desired future conditions that is often **specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and time-specific** (SMART; performance measures may also be used)

A **method or plan** to achieve objectives, goals, or policies; often longer term than actions. Supported by **actions/tactics** that are actual steps taken to achieve a strategy; often short-term and concrete

A broad **category of comparison** or estimation. Supported and measured by **metrics/targets** as a standard or comparison; a quantifiable variable



## Policy inventory, analysis, and creation

- •SDOT staff compiled policy statements from Seattle's existing comprehensive plan, modal plans, and strategic plans
- The result was 250+ lines of policy statements
- Identifying key policy gaps and conflicts
- Co-creation of policy framework



#### What we heard from SBAB on November 3, 2021 during the scoping phase

- Will this plan replace the modal plans?
  - No separate modal plans. The STP will include a bicycle element chapter.
- How does this relate to the modal integration work ongoing during the time of briefing?
  - This work is incomplete. We are considering whether it should be part of the approach for the STP
- How do you resolve modal conflicts?
  - The current approach is resolving it at the project level. The STP will establish network integration policy and maps of priority investment networks
- How does this plan relate to the Vision Zero plan?
  - Safety is a priority value for the STP

- Performance measures are part of the STP
- How extensively will the existing 2014 Bike Master Plan network be reexamined?
  - A lot of work went into the 2014 map, so that is our starting point. From there we will talk about how we want to grow the network. We've heard about some connections don't make sense anymore or other important connections were never included. We have analyzed some choke points in the system and will be using those results to update the network as well.
- How does this relate to the executive order Mayor Durkan issued at the Climate Action Summit?
  - It is the same thing.
