Service Planning 101 - King County Metro Guest Speaker: Ryan Miller (Service Planner)

-Responsible for network design, implementation of all transit services

- Terminology: Frequency (how often transit comes) & span (when transit runs ex) 6am-6pm)

-High Frequency: 15 minutes of better (6am-7pm) 30 minutes or better (7pm-10pm)

-Peak Service: Monday - Friday (6am-9pm/3pm-7pm)

-Rider Types (commuters, off peak & shift workers, seniors, persons with disabilities, & youth)

-Service Types (Rapid Ride, Frequent Bus, Local Bus, Express Bus, & Flexible Services)

-Equity: full & equal access in terms of opportunities, power, and resources

-Priority Populations have greatest need historically & contemporarily

Service Planning Best Practices:

-routes that serve many destinations and purposes

-routes that are easy to understand

-routes should not duplicate each other

-routes should connect to regional services

-routes should be direct and not circuitous

-routes with bus stops that are spaced to balance access and speed

-routes should not be too short or too long -routes should match service types and demand

Common service design tradeoffs: space tradeoffs, timing tradeoffs, and quality of service tradeoffs

Transit network design activity: break into smaller groups & brainstorm with maps and twizzlers
