What you can expect

- Signs and traffic control flaggers will guide vehicles through the work zone
- There will likely be noise from trucks and heavy machinery
- Some customers may experience a short interruption of natural gas service during this time. We will
 notify impacted customers prior to beginning work requiring an interruption in service
 - o If you are home when the work is complete, a technician will reconnect your natural gas service and complete safety checks on your gas appliances immediately
 - If you are not home when the work is complete, please give us a call at 1-888-225-5773 and a technician will be out as soon as possible to reconnect your natural gas service
- This work should not impact electric service in the area

Sewer safety

If our project involves being underground near your sewer or septic lines, we will conduct a follow-up inspection of your lines by inserting a camera through them. Although our installers take care to avoid sewer and septic lines, on rare occasions, a gas pipeline is inadvertently installed through those lines, which are often not mapper or detectable using above-ground sensors.
