Other Construction Restrictions

In addition to the closure of SR 99, our Holiday Construction Moratorium, in the [Downtown Retail Core and Pioneer Square](#) begins on Thanksgiving Day, November 22, 2018 and lasts through New Year’s Day, January 1, 2019. Our [Chinatown-International District](#) moratorium begins on January 15 and lasts through February 26, 2019.

SR 99 CLOSURE AND STREET USE PERMITTING IMPACTS



Project Overview

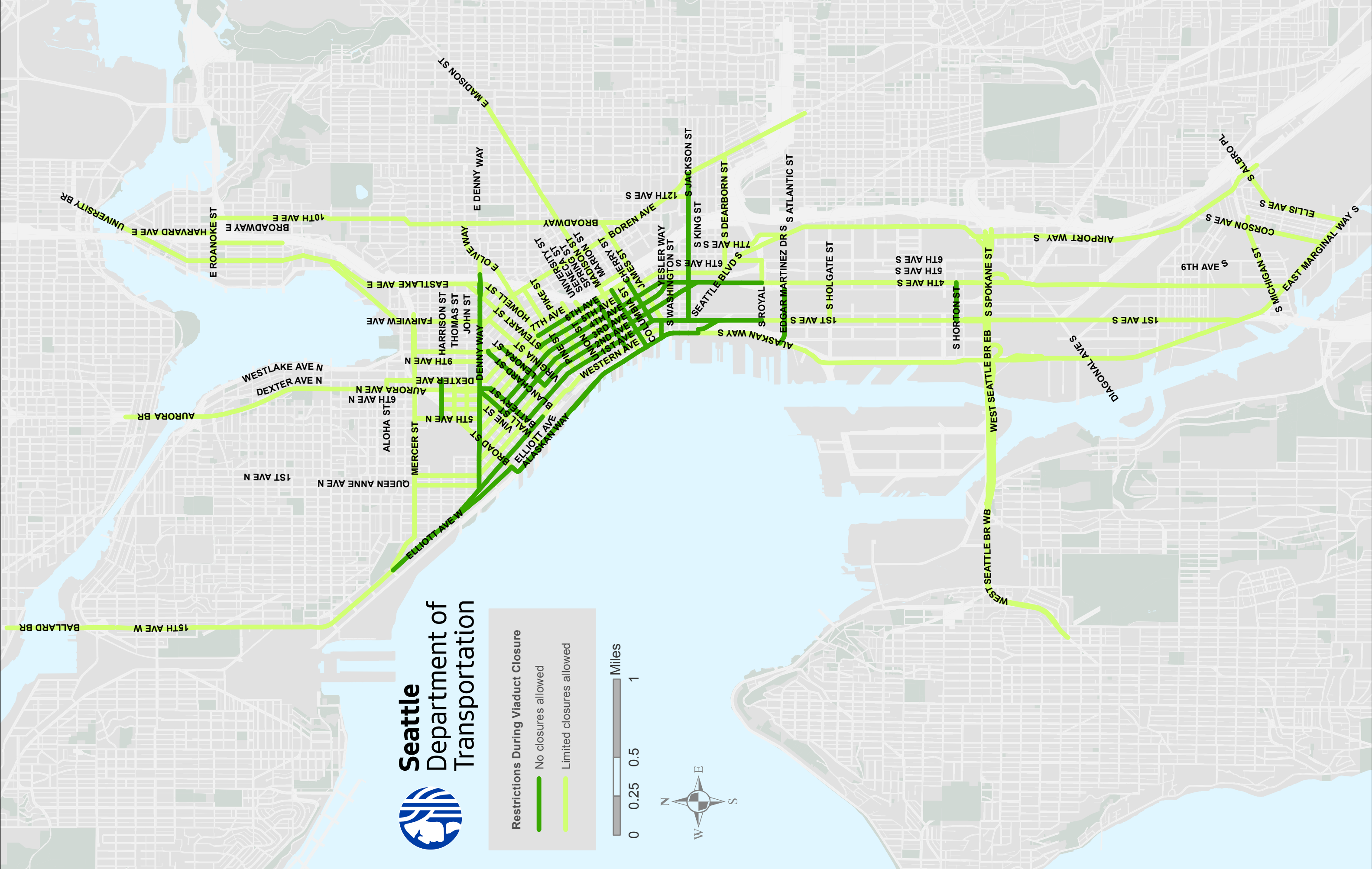
Based on information provided by WSDOT, on January 11, 2019, [State Route 99 through downtown Seattle will be closing for approximately three weeks to realign SR 99 into the new tunnel](#). During the closure, both the viaduct and the tunnel will be closed. Drivers should expect up to six weeks of region-wide congestion. In addition to the three-week closure:

- The southbound SR 99 off-ramp to South Atlantic Street will close a week earlier, on January 4, 2019.
- A new off-ramp from northbound SR 99 to South Dearborn Street will require one to two additional weeks of work after the tunnel opens.

Right-of-Way Restrictions

To minimize transportation impacts, construction and curbspace vending will be restricted on critical streets from January 4 – February 15, 2019. Please see the Restrictions During Viaduct Closure map on the inside of this document showing streets where right-of-way closures will not be permitted. This map is also located online at www.seattle.gov/Documents/Departments/SDOT/Services/Permits/Restrictions_During_Viaduct_Closure.pdf.

If work has been scheduled during the restriction period, we will contact you prior to the closure of the viaduct. **Your permit may be revoked with at least 30 calendar days’ notice, per SMC 15.04.070. Any revoked permits will be re-issued after the closure with no additional costs.**
