3rd Ave Improvements

What's happening

We're making changes to 3rd Ave in downtown and Pioneer Square to make buses more reliable and efficient and streets safer and more comfortable for people walking, biking, and rolling. Over the next 2 years, we will be:

- Building street, sidewalk, and bus stop upgrades in Pioneer Square
- Expanding the 6 AM 7 PM bus only restrictions 3 blocks further north to Blanchard St
- Repaving 3rd Ave between Virgina St and Pine St and between Yesler Way and S Main St
- Working with King County Metro to upgrade real-time information kiosks at bus stops


This is just one part of the City of Seattle's bigger plan to make downtown safer, easier to get around, and more welcoming.

Schedule

- We are designing safety improvements at 3rd Ave S and S Main St and 3rd Ave and Yesler Way in 2023 and plan to begin construction as soon as early 2024
- We expect to extend the 3rd Ave transit corridor to Blanchard St by Fall 2024, and begin repaving 3rd Ave between Virginia St and Pine St in Summer 2024
- We'll continue working with King County Metro to upgrade real-time information kiosks at bus stops throughout 2024




