### **Briefing**

Marshall Foster described the department's use of urban design frameworks to bring land use, urban design and transportation together into one plan for subareas of the city. Frameworks aid implementation and guide the built form. The department has developed a few frameworks; more are underway. Capitol Hill, Mount Baker and West Seattle Triangle are three notable examples. The commission should participate in early workshops of new urban design frameworks; one will cover the University District.

The next waterfront presentation to the joint Planning and Design Commission will be in July. James Corner, the lead designer, will present. The review will inform the refinement of the designs presented in May. This summer the waterfront team will lead walking tours when viaduct is closed. Waterfront management team is responsible for integration of all the plans. For example, Railroad Ave is now part of the waterfront project. The commission should get a briefing from adjoining projects, like South Downtown.
