SIMULTANEOUS FILING OF: Approved Substantial Development Permit (SDP)
And Approved Conditional Use Permit (CUP) #2017-NW-3702**

Dear Mr. Meyer:

On April 4, 2017, we received the City of Seattle – Department of Construction and Inspections decision on your SDP to allow improvements to an existing container cargo facility (Terminal 5), including removal and replacement of portions of pier structure, crane rails, decking, piling, dredging of 48,000 cubic yards of sediment, and under pier slope stabilization. The project also includes installation of an electrical substation and utility upgrades.

The City's decision also recommends approval of a CUP to allow installation of a sheet pile wall waterward of the ordinary high water mark at a depth between -47 and -53 (MLLW).

We have filed your approved SDP.

By law, Ecology must review CUPs for compliance with:

- The Shoreline Management Act (Chapter 90.58 RCW).
- Ecology's CUP approval criteria (Chapter 173-27-160 WAC).
- The City of Seattle Local Shoreline Master Program.

After reviewing a local CUP approval for compliance, Ecology must decide whether to approve, approve with conditions, or disapprove the proposal.

Our Decision on Your CUP

Ecology approves your CUP provided your project complies with the conditions required by the City's decision (#3019071) dated April 3, 2017.

Please note, however, that other federal, state, and local permits may be required in addition to this shoreline permit.

What Happens Next?


Before you begin activities authorized by this permit, the law requires you wait at least 21 days from April 13, 2017, the “date of filing.” This waiting period allows anyone (including you) who disagrees with any aspect of this permit, to appeal the decision to the state Shorelines Hearings Board. You must wait for the conclusion of an appeal before you can begin the activities authorized by this permit.

The Shorelines Hearings Board will notify you by letter if they receive an appeal. We recommend you contact the Shorelines Hearings Board before you begin permit activities to ensure no appeal has been received. You may reach them at (360) 664-9160 or <http://www.eho.wa.gov/>.
