

# Northgate Open Space and Pedestrian Connections Workshop

## Summary and Themes

### This is what we heard

- Improve pedestrian access to neighborhood-serving businesses
- Make better pedestrian connections throughout the Urban Center Core and surrounding neighborhoods
- Increase pedestrian priority along and crossing major corridors (e.g. 1-5, Northgate Way)
- Increase usable/accessible open space in new public and private developments, taking advantage of natural features.

- Receive and consider Planning Commission recommendations
- Develop a draft Open Space/Pedestrian Connection Plan that recommends implementation actions and policy and/or regulatory changes and includes an implementation strategies
