PURPOSE

The purpose of this rule is to adjust the amount of relocation assistance, as provided for in SMC Section 22.210.130.A., by the percentage amount of change in the Housing Component of the Consumer Price Index as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

BACKGROUND

The Tenant Relocation Assistance Ordinance, Seattle Municipal Code 22.210 *et seq.*, provides for advance notice to all tenants who will be displaced by demolition, substantial rehabilitation, change of use, or removal of use restrictions from housing units, and for the payment of relocation assistance to eligible low-income tenant households. The Ordinance took effect on July 2, 1990.

Subsection A of SMC Section 22.210.130, "Relocation Assistance Payments," provides as follows:

...The amount of relocation assistance shall be adjusted annually by the percentage amount of change in the housing component of the Consumer Price Index, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. Such adjustments shall be published in a Director's rule.

The amount of relocation assistance was last adjusted in 2008 by Director's Rule 8-2008. The total amount to be paid was increased from \$2,829.00 to \$3002.00. This rule is necessary to comply with the requirement to adjust the amount of relocation assistance payments.

METHODOLOGY

The Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes two Consumer Price Indices, one for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) and one for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). The index for All Urban Consumers has been selected for the purpose of adjusting the amount of relocation assistance because it covers a much broader segment of the population: eighty percent (80%) versus thirty-two percent (32%). In addition to wage earners and clerical workers, the CPI-U includes groups such as managerial, professional and technical workers, self-employed and short-term workers, unemployed persons, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The Housing Component of the CPI-U for all U.S. cities changed by the following amounts for the years 2008 through 2012.

The total adjustment per year, rounded to the nearest dollar, starting with the current relocation assistance amount of \$3002 and using the CPI-U percentages shown above is as follows:

Adjusting the current relocation assistance amount by the CPI increase or decrease for the years 2008-2012 yields \$3188 rounded to the nearest dollar.

RULE

The amount of relocation assistance required by subsection A of SMC 22.210.130 shall be \$3188.00. This amount shall apply to all Tenant Relocation License applications that are submitted on or after November 6, 2013.
