In all residential zones except Highrise, the ridge of a pitched roof on a principal structure is permitted to extend up to five feet above the height limit, so long as the pitch is at least three in twelve. In interpreting this provision, pitch shall mean the rate of slope, that is, vertical rise over horizontal run.

REASON: Although some architectural texts make a distinction between "pitch" and "slope" as ordinarily used, they are synonymous. DCLU will use the ordinary meaning of pitch, i.e., "rate of slope."

$$PITCH = RISE / RUN = \frac{x}{y}$$
