Re: SEPA Closeout

This memorandum documents the completion of the SEPA process for the Environmental Checklist and the threshold Determination of Non-Significance (DNS).

The DNS was issued and sent to the Washington Department of Ecology SEPA Public Information Center, and was entered in the SEPA Register for the issuance date of March 9, 2015. It was published in the Daily Journal of Commerce in the March 9th and March 16th editions, and included in the Seattle Department of Planning and Development Land Use Information Bulletin on March 9th. The DNS was transmitted timely to the Seattle Times and appeared both on-line and in the printed edition on March 9th.

The comment period ended on March 23rd, and no comments were received. The appeal period ended on March 30th, and no appeals were filed.

The SEPA process is completed, and the project is authorized to proceed, contingent on any other required permits and approvals.
