

Seattle Municipal Court Judicial Candidates

Voters' Pamphlet Information

This information applies to Seattle Municipal Court Judicial candidates only.

Candidates who wish to have their statement included in the General Election Voters' Pamphlet must deliver their Voters' Pamphlet statement and photo to the Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission no later than **Thursday, August 12 at 4:30 p.m.**

Candidates for Seattle Municipal Court judge are subject to the [Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission](#)'s Voter Pamphlet [Rules](#).

Under the SEEC [rules](#)

- Candidates are allowed **400 words** for their statement
- Candidates are prohibited from **discussing their opponent** in the Voters' Pamphlet
- Candidate **photos** must be less than two years old
- Candidates cannot be shown wearing a **judicial robe**
- Uniforms, hats, buttons, and insignias** are prohibited in candidate photos.

The SEEC Voters Pamphlet rules specify the [format](#) for candidate statements and photos and additional details on requirements and prohibitions. Please review them carefully before submitting your statement and photo.

The Seattle Voters' Pamphlet is published in conjunction with the King County pamphlet. Voter Pamphlets will be delivered approximately three weeks before Election Day.

Deliver your Voters Pamphlet Statement of 400 words or less and a photo, by email to ethicsandelections@seattle.gov, no later than **4:30 p.m** on **Thursday, August 12, 2010**. Statements must be sent as an attachment to an email in Microsoft Word, or easily convertible to Word (no pdfs please!). Photos can be in tiff, or jpeg. Statements and photos must be **in our office** no later than 4:30 p.m. Thursday, August 12, 2010.
