The Seattle City Council Environment, Emergency Management and Utilities Committee will be holding an evening meeting to hear comments on the Zero Waste Study report, titled "Seattle Solid Waste Recycling, Waste Reduction, and Facilities Opportunities." The report also evaluates several options for upgrading Seattle's transfer stations and potentially constructing a third, intermodal station. **The main purpose of this meeting is to solicit opinion about the various facility improvement options but comments about proposed waste reduction programs and policies are also welcome.** Comments will be used to finalize a resolution identifying new policy directions, solid waste programs, and facilities improvements.
