Introducing the Quick Lighting Upgrade Initiative

Through our new Quick Lighting Upgrade rebates, we're helping our business customers upgrade their obsolete T12 fluorescent lighting to new energy-saving T8 lighting. T8 lighting uses significantly less energy—as much as 35% less! Switching to T8 lighting will lower your electric bill and give you better quality lighting.

Why Seattle City Light helps pay for lighting upgrades

We offer incentives such as free building surveys, technical assistance and rebates to business customers as a way to encourage the use of energy conservation technologies. Conservation is a cost effective and clean energy resource. Taking steps to save energy rather than acquiring additional power saves money and resources. Replacing obsolete T12 lighting is just one way for us to help you cut costs and save energy. There are thousands of these lights in our service area wasting energy every day. How to get a Quick Lighting Upgrade rebate

- 1 Call (206) 684-3800.
- 2 Work with a City Light energy analyst to evaluate your lighting project and estimate your rebate. Due to high demand, current projects must be completed before new lighting evaluations can be conducted. Call your analyst for details on when your facility can be surveyed.
- 3 Secure authorization from City Light prior to your contractor starting work.
- 4 Proceed with the installation and contact City Light for final verification when work is complete.

Just like Stella Color, you could improve your lighting and save money

Employees at Stella Color, a large-format digital printer, were unable to review the color accuracy of their work under their old lighting. With help from a Seattle City Light rebate, they replaced 53 old T12 lights and 27 high-pressure sodium fixtures with T8 lighting. They can now proof jobs anywhere in the production area, and as Owner Lynn Krinsky says, “We’re saving over \$2,000 a year on electricity.”

How to find a lighting contractor


Any licensed contractor can secure Quick Lighting rebates — the contractor you choose, however, is at your discretion. We encourage you to secure competitive bids since contractor pricing and terms may vary.

If you don’t have a lighting contractor, you can find one through our Emerald Trade Ally network. These contractors have participated in our lighting programs and can help you qualify for conservation rebates.

Check your lighting to see if you are wasting money

How can you tell if you have obsolete T12 lighting? Just look at the end of one of your fluorescent light tubes. If its diameter is wider than a quarter, it’s probably an inefficient T12. Another way to tell is if your lighting buzzes and flickers—that won’t happen with the electronic ballasts found in T8 lights.



Other Quick Lighting rebates available

While you’re upgrading to T8 lighting, you may also qualify for two other Quick Lighting rebates:

- **Exit signs.** We will pay up to the full cost of replacing your existing incandescent or fluorescent light bulb signs with energy-efficient LED (light-emitting diode) signs.
- **CFLs.** We will pay up to the full cost for replacing your existing incandescent bulbs with commercial-grade compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs). Your energy analyst can tell you what types of CFLs qualify for the rebate.

Additional rebates, which can pay up to 70% of the cost of adopting other energy conservation technologies, are also available to our business customers.



The City of Seattle is a national leader in protecting the environment. Seattle residents and businesses are joining in efforts to help reduce the negative impacts of climate change.

The Quick Lighting Upgrade rebate is a limited time offer designed to pay up to 100% of the cost of specific energy conservation technologies for typical installations. Seattle City Light will fund only the portion of the project yielding energy conservation. For example, the program does not fund installation costs that are not typical, additional electrical work to meet code, or electrical permits. In medium and large commercial and industrial facilities, at least 90% of the fluorescent lights must be in operation more than 2,000 per year and the lighting incentive must be \$500 or more to qualify for the rebate. Seattle City Light management must approve the project prior to purchase or installation of equipment or materials. This program may change without notice and is subject to the availability of funds.

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
