**SERVICE POLES AND ANCHORS
ON PRIVATE PROPERTY**

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1.0 Policy

- 1.1 The Department may require service poles and anchors on private property in accordance with the Service Poles section of the Requirements for Electrical Service Connection.
 - 1.1.1 The customer shall be charged a standard labor fee for installing poles and/or anchors where the distance from an existing pole to the service entrance is such that additional poles and/or anchors on private property are required. The charge for installation is found in §2.1.
 - 1.1.2 If an easement is required by the Department for extension of the distribution system onto a customer's property for purposes of serving multiple buildings or other customers, the Department will install poles and/or anchors free of charge.
 - 1.1.3 If the customer's choice of service entrance location is such that the distance from the existing pole on the right-of-way to the service entrance on private property causes additional service poles and anchors to be required, and when an alternative location exists which would not require additional poles and/or anchors, charges shall include the full cost of the pole and/or anchor, in addition to the installation costs. The charge for installation of poles and anchors is found at §2.2.
- 1.2 If the Department is requested to set a service pole adjacent to a mobile home on an individual owner lot, as explained in the Mobile Homes on Individual Owner Lot section of "Requirements for Electric Service Connection," charges shall include the full cost for the pole and/or anchor, in addition to the installation costs.

1.3 Charges for furnishing and setting primary service poles and anchors shall be determined for each individual installation and based on the Department's actual cost of labor, plus cost for materials for such installation.

1.3.1 The charge for furnishing and setting primary service poles and anchors is found at §2.2.4.

1.3.2 The Department shall credit customers for the costs paid for salvageable materials when such materials are returned to the Department.

1.4 The Department maintains service poles as necessary.

1.4.1 If the customer was charged for only installation of the pole and/or anchor, the Department shall maintain the pole and/or anchor.

1.4.2 If the customer was charged for the full cost of the pole and/or anchor, in addition to the installation costs, the Department shall maintain the pole and/or anchor if the customer pays the appropriate maintenance costs. See §2.3.

2.0 Charges (Based on 30-foot pole; if pole(s) to be set are not 30 foot, an estimate shall be calculated by the Department.)

2.1 Installation only.

2.1.1 Setting one service pole, one anchor, and one guy

2.2.4 Furnishing and setting primary service poles and anchors and guy(s)

2.3 Maintenance for poles and anchors and guy(s).
