¹Federal agencies distribute stimulus funds to cities primarily two ways:

By formula. Funds allocated by a formula – usually set in law – go to states and localities. Examples include: Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grants, Community Development Block Grants, and Highway Infrastructure Investment.

By competition. These funds are allocated through a competitive process. In the coming weeks, state and federal agencies will distribute requests for proposals and convene panels to evaluate applications.

⁴The lead applicant for this grant is the Puget Sound Clean Air Agency - Puget Sound Clean Cities Coalition. Seattle is a sub-recipient in their proposal.

⁵While more than three-quarters of the \$200 million total project funding has been secured, the City is actively pursuing funding for the remaining \$50 million. Seattle is seeking federal grant funds through annual appropriations, the Puget Sound Regional Council's Surface Transportation Program/Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Grant process, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act "Supplemental Discretionary Grants for a National Surface Transportation System" and other grant processes.
