Notes from Manufacturing Industrial Council Meeting May 27, 2008

Following are notes taken from the discussion at the Manufacturing Industrial Council meeting held in its offices in the Georgetown neighborhood on May 27, 2008. Approximately 15 people attended the meeting. Catherine Cornwall from the City and Wiley Brooks from The Keller Group attended; Ms. Cornwall gave a 10-minute overview that took those present through the information packet that they were given, then opened the floor to questions. There were few actual questions, with this section of the meeting lasting only 20 minutes, including Ms. Cornwall's overview. These notes are an attempt to capture the questions and comments that were raised, in the order that they came up.

Questions and points raised by meeting participants:

- What was the reaction of the Port of Seattle (to the Interbay site)?
- Is the Interbay site the old Northwest Industries site?
- Which of the four sites is the preferred alternative?
- Does the City own the land that the Myers Way site would occupy?
- If the City were to choose the Interbay site would the City and Port of Seattle share the costs of providing services (utilities) there?
- Is the Myers Way site even feasible with all the environmental concerns?
- If we joined with the Eastside, would they use our jail?
- Is King County's jail population increasing? Is that what's driving this?
