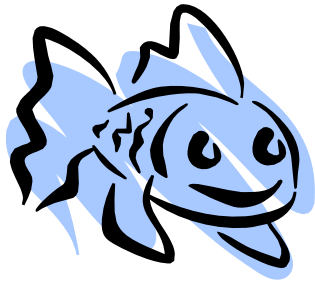

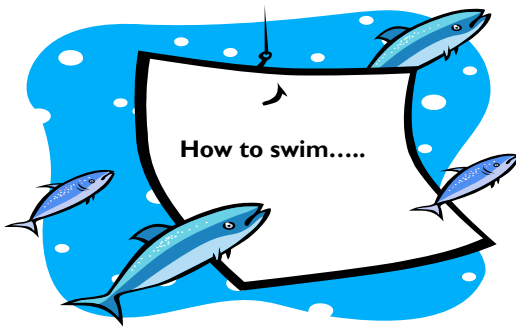

This program is intended for elementary and middle school-aged children and their parents. Each child must be accompanied 1:1 in the water by an adult.

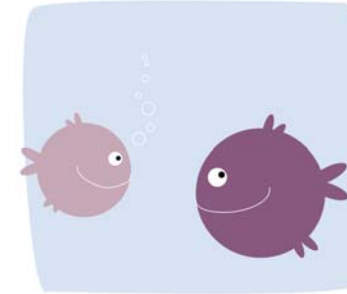

Beginning swimming skills taught in this program include water adjustment, bubble blowing, breath holding, kicking on front, back float, and using a life jacket.

Be "WATER SAFE" in a city surrounded by water!

Answers:

- 1) Fish automatically know how to swim as hatchlings. School of fish means a group of fish swimming together.
- 2) Fish can rest while swimming, but they don't have eyelids, so they can't close their eyes.
- 3) They have short conversations. Some fish talk using bubbles or scents.
- 4) Only if you bother them. Crabs are usually quite happy when left alone.
- 5) Most fish have friends and enjoy spending time swimming with them. Fish hang out together in schools for safety and social time.
- 6) Gills collect oxygen from the water to provide fish with the air they need, just as our lungs do for us.
- 7) The Indo-Pacific Sailfish has been clocked at 68 miles per hour!
