The Seattle Police Foundation has been a part of our great city for the past nine years. We're committed to building a strong and positive relationship between our citizens and the Seattle Police Department, by providing our law enforcement professionals with equipment, education, training and sponsorship of community outreach programs.

During these tough economic times, the Foundation has strengthened its support of vital initiatives. In 2010, the Foundation funded more than 25 projects and programs. Since 2002, the Foundation has raised over \$3.5 million to support 225 programs and initiatives. For every dollar raised by the Foundation, approximately 80 cents has gone to support programs that help the people of the Seattle Police Department become better law enforcement professionals.



In 2010, we were also reminded of the complexities of the policing profession and the challenges our police encounter every day in their mission to keep our city safe. Each year, our police officers have over 500,000 contacts with citizens and the overwhelming majority of these interactions are concluded peacefully.

In 2011, the Foundation will celebrate ten years of partnership with the Seattle Police Department. We will spend 2011 and every year going forward, committed to working with the Seattle Police Department and our fellow citizens to ensure that our police are leaders in the areas of professional development, education, resources and community outreach.

This annual report describes 2010's partnerships and progress. We're thankful for the hard work of our Board Members, the generosity of our contributors and the ongoing support from law enforcement professionals. We look forward to a 2011 filled with even more opportunities to empower, educate and honor the men and women of the Seattle Police Department.

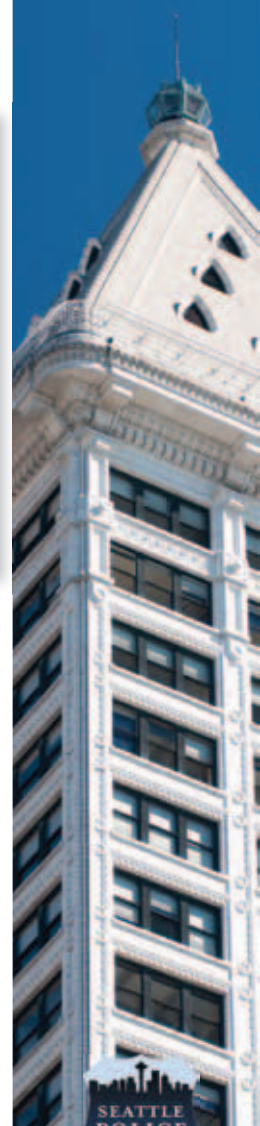

WHAT WE DO

The Seattle Police Foundation helps keep Seattle safe by raising awareness and support for the Seattle Police Department. SPF does this by responding to requests from Seattle police officers to support programs and projects they believe will help them do their jobs better-more safely, efficiently and effectively. We also do this by ensuring the Seattle community has opportunities to interact with their police force in non-enforcement situations and to learn about the police department.

SPF supports three funding areas-Community Partnerships, Employee Development and Recognition, and Law Enforcement Enhancements.

SPF hosts events including- Breakfast with the Chief, Picnic at the Precincts, and the Annual Awards Banquet.

The following highlights our 2010 programs. Everything we fund supports our mission to support the Seattle Police Department and works in partnership to keep Seattle safe.

SPF LOOKS TO THE FUTURE BY HELPING TO PRESERVE THE PAST

Saving the Mounted Patrol

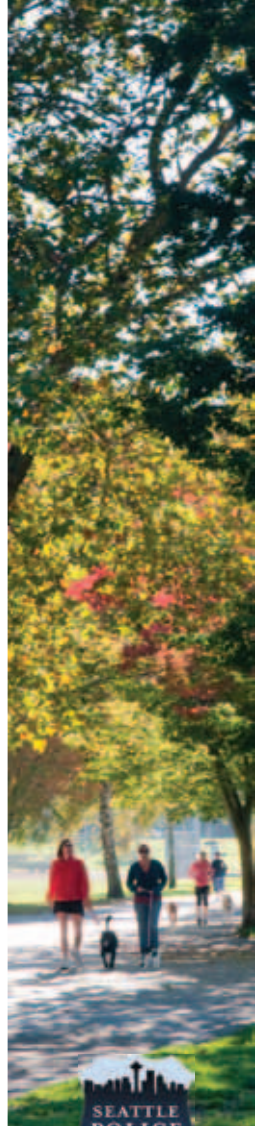
For over a hundred years the Seattle Police Department has had a Mounted Patrol Unit. They perform a variety of safety and outreach functions. The SPD's budget constraints put the Mounted Patrol in jeopardy, until the Seattle Police Foundation stepped up to help preserve this important tool. The Seattle Police Foundation has made a commitment to maintain the food, care and support for our Mounted Unit horses for three years. The money donated by the community to this project will go directly to support the horses of the mounted patrol.

The officers and sergeant in the unit are funded by the general fund and also work regular patrol shifts. Donations will allow these officers to have the option to use the Mounted Patrol to fight crime and provide security/crowd-control in downtown Seattle, reduce fear through their presence and provide valuable opportunities to connect with and strengthen the community.

SPF HELPED THE SEATTLE COMMUNITY BE PREPARED FOR EMERGENCIES

Emergency Communication Hub Sites

Funds from SPF supported the purchase of the necessary equipment (hand held radios and repeaters) for the establishment of "Emergency Communication Hubs," that will be staffed by community volunteers during emergency events. If Seattle were to experience a disaster similar to the earthquakes in Japan and Haiti, the City's response capabilities are likely to be overwhelmed in the first few days. Day-to-day basic services may no longer be available and normal modes of communications will not be functional. Community members will need to rely on each other for extended periods of time until services are restored. Establishment of these emergency communication hubs will ensure Seattle's citizens are able to come together and provide help to those who need help.

SPF IMPACTED LIVES THROUGH INNOVATIVE CUTTING EDGE PARTNERSHIPS

The If Project

The SPF continued its support of the If Project, an innovative partnership between police and incarcerated women. Over 500 women inmates at the Washington Corrections Center for Women (WCCW) have written essays answering the question, “If there is something someone could have said or done that would have changed the path that led you here, what would it have been?”

Through essays, interviews, and workshops, the If Project shares the women’s experiences with youth (especially girls, who are the fastest growing population in juvenile corrections), with the goal of encouraging youth to seek needed services.

Eight former WCCW inmates have joined the If Project Team, and are helping to present a series of truancy reduction workshops at the Bridge House. The If Project Team believes in the power of people to change, and in the power of writing and speaking to help themselves and others to live healthier lives. The team now includes former inmates and celebrates the fact that over 500 women have contributed their voices to the If Project and that If has helped many of these women to reconnect with family, to heal relationships, and to help to heal others.



FOUNDATION PROJECTS

SPF BROUGHT THE POLICE AND COMMUNITY TOGETHER

Annual Precinct Picnics

To fulfill our mission, SPF is committed to facilitating positive community and police interactions as part of our Community Partnership program area. In 2004 SPF implemented the Picnic at the Precinct program. Picnic at the Precinct provides an opportunity for the business and residential communities in the precinct geographical boundaries to come together and enjoy a day of celebration with their local police. Attendees have the opportunity to take precinct tours, meet and learn more about their local police officers, as well as enjoy great food, music, and entertainment. Local businesses financially support the event through donations to the SPF, and local community groups assist in planning.

The first Picnic at the Precinct was held in September 2004 at the East Precinct. Since then, the Picnic at the Precinct program has grown to include all five precincts, and in 2011 the first Harbor Picnic will be introduced.

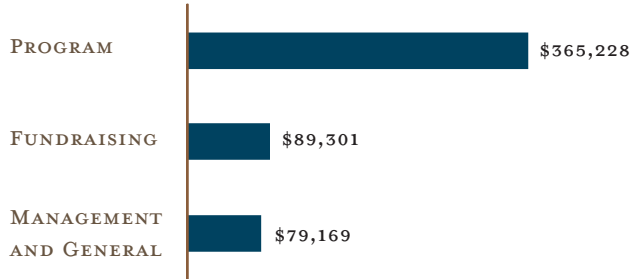

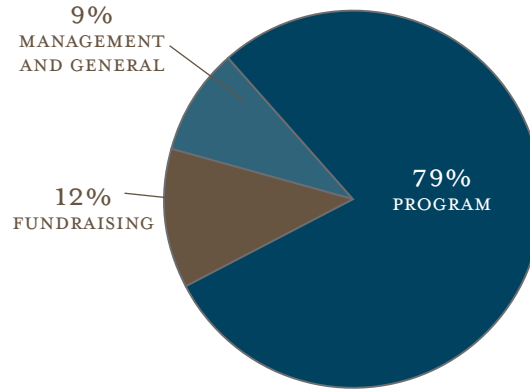

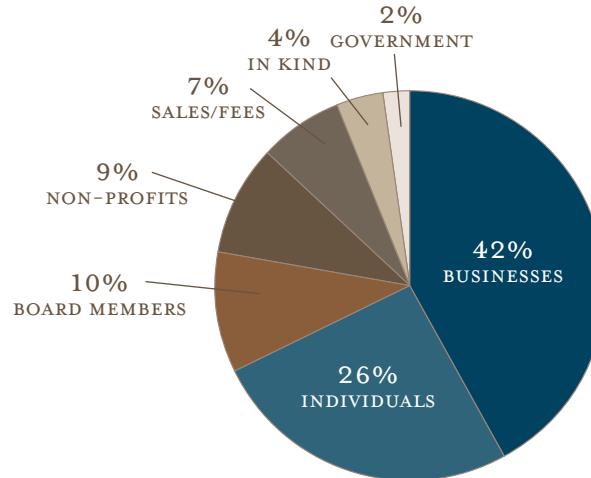
2010 EXPENSES

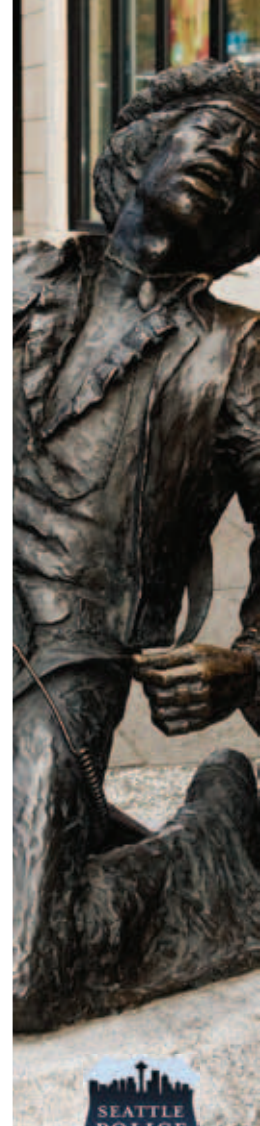
