

ROOSEVELT WAY NE BICYCLE AND TRANSIT IMPROVEMENTS

January 2015

Making the corridor predictable and safer for all travelers

The Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) is repaving Roosevelt Way NE between Fuhrman Ave NE and NE 65th Street and adding safety improvements starting this fall. Along with meeting Seattle's basic maintenance needs, we're adding transit reliability and improving sidewalks, as well as installing a one-way protected bike lane (PBL) on the west side of Roosevelt Way NE. These changes will make Roosevelt feel more like a neighborhood business street and less like an alternative to I-5.

We'd like to invite you to attend a drop-in session to meet with project staff, ask questions and share your insight on access needs and how we can continue to meet them with the addition of a facility.






Project Description


The two existing general purpose lanes will remain and we'll continue to prioritize bus service. However, on-street parking and loading zones would be removed on the west side of the street. We know that businesses and residents can come to rely on public parking and do not take this lightly. Before implementing a project, we review our Complete Streets Ordinance, city policies and goals, and in this case the bicycle and transit master plans. We also collect parking data (currently underway).

We also work with the public to understand their access needs and determine how we can continue to meet them with the addition of the new facility. Three drop-in sessions are being held the week of January 19. We're also conducting door to door outreach and meeting with individual businesses and neighborhood groups. The project is scheduled to start in Fall 2015.
