Project purpose

The Center City Bike Network supports a vibrant Seattle by designing a safer, more predictable traveling experience for people walking, biking and driving downtown.

Sounding Board purpose

Better bike infrastructure can benefit everyone especially when various perspectives are involved in the planning. The purpose of the Sounding Board is to provide the Seattle Department of Transportation with feedback during design development of a protected bike lane network that improves safety, connectivity and economic vitality in downtown Seattle.

- Discuss project evaluation criteria
- Provide input on priorities for design and construction
- Share project updates with their communities
